DR. NOBLE IRWIN REGIONAL HEALTHCARE FOUNDATION INC. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2011

The purpose of the Foundation is to raise, administer and disburse funds to improve the quality of health care for the people of Southwest Saskatchewan. The Foundation was incorporated under the Non-profit Corporation Act of Saskatchewan on October 31, 1998.

2. Significant accounting policies

These financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. The more significant accounting policies are as follows:

(a) Fund accounting

The accounts of the Foundation are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. For financial reporting purposes, accounts with similar characteristics have been combined into the following major funding groups:

The operating fund reflects the revenue and expenses related to achieving the mission of the Foundation including administrative expenses, unrestricted donations, and unrestricted contributions.

ii) Restricted fund

The restricted fund reflects revenues that are designated for specific purposes by the contributor and the related expenses.

iii) Endowment fund

The endowment fund reflects permanent contributions. The income on the endowment fund is recorded in the restricted fund and is to be used for restricted purposes.

The Foundation follows the restricted fund method of accounting for contributions as follows:

Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the appropriate fund in the period it is received or receivable. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the appropriate fund when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably

Inventory is valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value.

All investments are classified as held-for-trading. The fair market value of the held-for-trading investments was determined by reference to quoted market prices.

(e) Capital assets

Capital assets are recorded at cost and are amortized on a declining basis as follows:

(f) Contributed services and goods

The operations of the Foundation utilize services of many volunteers. Since these services are not normally purchased, and because of the difficulty in determining the fair market value of donated services, the value of these donated services is not recognized in the financial statements, except as they relate to the construction of the habitat for healthcare facility.

The Foundation is a registered charity within the meaning of the Income Tax Act and is; therefore, exempt from income taxes under Section 149(1) of the Act.

Included in yearend receivables is \$182,000 relating to an estate bequest which includes the sale of a house and land that formed part of the estate. The amounts accrued are the Board's best estimate based on information available at that time

Inventory is comprised of fundraising supplies, communication supplies, office supplies and gift shop inventory for resale and is valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value.

9. Financial Instruments

(a) Significant terms and conditions

There are no significant terms and conditions related to financial instruments classified as current assets or current liabilities that may affect the amount timing and certainty of future cash flows. Significant terms and conditions for the other financial instruments are disclosed separately in these financial statements.

11. Reclassification of prior year figures

Certain of the prior year balances have been restated based on current year presentation.

12 Prior period adjustment

During 2010, it was determined certain balances set up as receivable and payable in prior years were not valid claims or receivables. As a result, a net of (\$1,535) was adjusted through the opening fund balance.

13. Future accounting policies

The Accounting Standards Board ("AcSB") has issued Part III of the CICA Handbook as accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations in the private sector. Part III comprises existing standards dealing with the unique circumstances of not-for-profit organizations and accounting standards for private enterprises in the CICA Handbook to the extent they apply to not-for-profit organizations. The AsSB also allows for the adoption of International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFPRS") by not-for-profit organizations. The organization has chosen not to adopt IFRSs and will continue to follow accounting standards for not-forprofit organizations in the private sector as outlined in the CICA Handbook. The organization will be required to adopt the new not for profit standards commencing with their December 31,2012 fiscal period

Independent Auditor's Report

To the Directors of

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Dr. Noble Irwin Regional Health Care Foundation Inc., which comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2011, and the statement of operations and fund balances and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with pre-changeover accounting standards, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the organization's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the organization's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

In common with many charitable organizations, the Foundation derives revenue from donations and fund-raising conducted by them and other organizations, the completeness of which is not susceptible of satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Foundation and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to fund-raising revenues, surplus for the year, assets and fund balances.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Dr. Noble Irwin Regional Health Care Foundation Inc. as at December 31, 2011, and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with pre-changeover accounting standards.
