### Pharmasave Radiothon



The 2018 Pharmasave Radiothon for Healthcare goal was to purchase a new digital portable x-ray unit for the Cypress Regional Hospital, which allows for bedside x-rays to be done quickly and effectively for patients either too ill or too injured to move to the main x-ray suite.

Our gratitude goes out to the many people who made Radiothon run as smoothly as it did. Thank you not only to our generous supporters and donors, but to the people who were responsible for taking those donations. Our phone bank was manned by volunteers throughout Radiothon to accept donations from those who called in as well as those who came to donate in person.

Pharmasave was our title sponsor once again for the 'Pharmasave Radiothon for Healthcare' and we thank them for their continued support. All told there were 19 major sponsors, to whom we say thank you for helping Keep Healthcare Strong in the Cypress Health Region.

A terrific addition to every single Radiothon is the talent that local performers come out and share with us as part of the broadcast. This live entertainment is often enjoyed by patients who are in care at Cypress Regional Hospital. Thank you to all the performers who add a special touch to our broadcast!

As always, thanks to our broadcasting group from Golden West Broadcasting for all of their time and talents and efforts. This year, they worked with us to bring our Radiothon to all three local radio stations, extending our reach and our coverage. It all went off without a hitch, and the results of this year's Pharmasave Radiothon for Healthcare speak for themselves.

Our grand total for this year's Radiothon, including many donations that came in after the show, was over \$182,000! Thank you to all who made it possible.



Tn 2018, the Dr. Noble Irwin Regional Healthcare Foundation chose **⊥** to raise funds and support for a portable digital x-ray machine. A machine that would not replace the main x-ray unit in the diagnostic imaging department, but that would complement it, and give better options for patients who require x-ray but are too injured or too ill to be transported to the main x-ray suite.

"The intention of the portable unit is to perform x-rays on patients who are too sick to come to the department for their x-ray. Mainly, ICU, ER, in-patient wards and the Nursery." - Donna Wotherspoon.

The Cypress Regional Hospital did have a portable x-ray unit prior to this new purchase, but not being digital it was a more cumbersome and time consuming process. The x-ray technician would have to bring the image cassette down to the x-ray department and then convert it to digital before being able to see if the picture was good enough to use, or if it was able to show what the doctor was trying to see. Now, with the digital portable x-ray, images taken are shown almost immediately, on screen at bedside, reducing the time needed by the technician and giving the doctors immediate diagnostic information. Also, being new technology, the new machine will take a better quality picture, and will subject the patient to less radiation than the old machine.

According to Donna Wotherspoon, the head of the Diagnostic Imaging Department at the Cypress Regional Hospital, the portable unit often sees between 800 and 1000 uses per year. This is in fact a small portion of the total number of x-rays done in the hospital which can be as many as 14,000 in a year.

Chantal Henderson, a nurse at the Cypress Regional Hospital, talked to us about her own personal experiences with a portable digital x-ray unit while we were preparing for Radiothon. Her daughter was only 11 days old when she was hospitalized for a respiratory infection. During



her care she was eventually transported to Saskatoon for care and was successfully treated. During the treatment procedure, Chantal was able to see first hand the process of bringing her daughter, who was hooked up to monitors and intubated, to the x-ray suite, and the difficulties associated with that. As well she saw how simple and non intrusive the portable digital x-ray in Saskatoon was. She is looking forward to using the portable digital x-ray in her job at Cypress Regional Hospital.

It's one of those things that when your kids, especially when they are that little, require something medical or are in a state of emergency, having something that makes the care more efficient and easier is just indescribable - Chantal Henderson

# People you have Helped!

### Patti-Jean Cobb



I have lymphedema as a result of complications from cancer surgery and for that reason, I am not able to have intravenous in my arms. It has been difficult for healthcare providers to find suitable veins in my legs and feet, but the anesthesiologist

at Cypress Regional Hospital, Dr. Jim Klonarakis, brought in the portable ultrasound machine and was able to easily locate a deeper vein in my foot. As a result of using the portable ultrasound machine, I was able to receive the medication I needed by intravenous without any complications. I am so grateful to the Dr. Noble Irwin Regional Healthcare Foundation and the donors who support them in making equipment purchases possible for our area hospital.

In the past it took between 15 & 20 attempts to find a vein in my feet or legs, and even then if the vein was too small the IV would blow out and another one would have to be started. Now with the Portable ultrasound, the medical staff are able to administer the medicine I need more quickly, effectively, and far more comfortably.

### **Ellie Rokochy**

On a July weekend at the ball diamonds here in Swift Current, our youngest son was playing ball, and I was scorekeeping. His sister had just ran to go across the street to the concession for a treat. Then a friend came



up and said, "You have to come, it's Ellie." As she had gone to cross the street, Ellie had been hit by a car. She was laying in the street not moving. It's a parent's nightmare.

Fortunately there were some first responders whose kids also played ball and they quickly helped as best they could until the ambulance came. On the ride to the hospital Ellie started to come around a bit, and once we arrived at the hospital, she was taken to the ER and examined. There were no outward signs of damage, but there was still concern that she could have internal damage.

Dr Kapusta quickly rolled in the portable ultra-sound unit that had been purchased with funds raised by the Dr. Noble Irwin Regional Healthcare Foundation. In a matter of minutes he was able to fully check out all of Ellie's internal organs, and give her the green light. She was going to be sore for a bit, but she was okay. Its such a sense of relief to be able to have her examined in this way and know that there were no hidden problems. As a parent, the comfort that came from that quick examination with this remarkable tool was invaluable.

### Leader / Climax

The Leader & District Integrated Healthcare Facility became a reality in 2018. After a few years of fundraising, planning, and building, the new acute care hospital and the newly renovated Western Senior Citizens Home had its grand opening on October 26th, 2018.

The community fundraising group in Leader did a sensational job of organizing fundraising activities, and involving all the citizens in the area in bringing this project together. All told they raised \$1.4M to equip and prepare this beautiful new facility.

The acute care hospital now boasts six acute care patient rooms as well as an indoor ambulance bay, and of course an all new facility. Plus being attached to the Western Senior Citizens Home means that those in long-term care have easy access to medical attention when necessary. As well, the long-term care rooms were updated with ceiling lifts to improve safety and mobility for the residents.

The overall community effort that was undertaken to make this a reality is impressive. The Leader and District Trust Advisory Committee has done an amazing job, and the Dr. Noble Irwin Regional Healthcare Foundation was pleased to be able to assist them in their efforts.

The Climax Border Health Center has been the beneficiary of a recent community effort to upgrade the facility. Starting at the beginning of 2018, a local fundraising committee and the Dr. Noble Irwin Regional Healthcare Foundation worked together to raise funds to improve services.

The success of the campaign was so significant that it was possible to not only replace the tub and build a new tub room, but extra funds were raised and used so that they are now able to offer Telehealth services, allowing community members to connect with their specialists through video conferencing. ### **Qualified Opinion**

The summary financial statements, which comprise the summary statement of financial position as at December 31, 2018 and the summary statement of operations for the year then ended are derived from the audited financial statements of the Dr. Noble Irwin Regional Healthcare Foundation Inc. for the year ended December 31, 2018. We expressed a qualified opinion on those financial statements in our report dated March 5, 2019.

In our opinion, the accompanying summary financial statements are a fair summary of the audited financial statements of Dr. Noble Irwin Healthcare Foundations Inc. which were prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. However, the summary financial statements are qualified to the equivalent extent as the audited financial statements of Dr. Noble Irwin Healthcare Foundation Inc. for the year ended December 31, 2018.

#### **Summary Financial Statements**

The summary financial statements do not contain all the disclosures required by Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. Reading the summary financial statements and the auditor's report thereon, is not a substitute for reading the organization's audited financial statements and the auditor's report thereon.

#### **The Audited Financial Statements and Our Report Thereon**

We expressed a qualified opinion on the audited financial statements in our report dated March 5, 2019. In common with many charitable organizations, the Foundation derives revenue from donations and fundraising conducted by itself and other organizations, the completeness of which is not susceptible of satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Foundation and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to fund-raising revenues, surplus for the year, assets and fund balances for the years ended December 31, 2018 and December 31, 2017.

#### **Management's Responsibility for the Summarized Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation of a summary of the audited financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

#### **Auditors' Responsibility**
